
SURVEY OVERVIEW AND RESPONDENT PROFILE

The Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce, MBAF, and the South Florida Business Journal are continuously gathering vital data as we aim to understand the impact COVID-19 is having on our SFL community and local businesses in efforts to best assist.


This report shares the results from our 3rd Survey in a coordinated effort to provide quarterly updates on how South Florida businesses are being affected by the Coronavirus Pandemic.

- 1st Survey: March 19 to April 16, 2020
 - 209 responses; Sent to 11,000+ Miami business contacts
- 2nd Survey: June 11 to July 23, 2020
 - 262 responses; Sent to 16,500+ SFL business contacts
- *3rd Survey*: Nov 16 to Dec 15, 2020
 - 365 responses; Sent to 17,000+ SFL business contacts
- 4th Survey: expected to run in Feb/March 2021





How optimistic are you about South Florida's economic recovery in 2021?




Leaders are more optimistic as 2021 approaches even though 76% of South Florida businesses have been negatively affected by the financial impact of the Coronavirus pandemic.

49% of businesses are more optimistic about the health of their business now compared to over the summer.

16% are less optimistic while 36% are about the same.

How has the overall financial impact of the Coronavirus pandemic affected your business?




Only 43% of businesses' physical locations are fully open.

PHYSICAL LOCATIONS

- 43% fully open
- 31% partially open
- 15% still closed
- 11% doesn't apply

67% OF BUSINESSES ARE FULLY OPERATING

This is up only 3% from our survey in August...
31% of businesses are partially operating while less
than 2% are still not operating yet.

How has the Coronavirus pandemic affected South Florida's workforce?

36% of businesses permanently lost staff as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic.

18% of businesses still have furloughed employees.

Only 41% of businesses are hiring new employees.

WHAT PERCENTAGE OF YOUR WORKFORCE IS WORKING REMOTELY?


49% of businesses still have more than half of their employees working remotely.





How has the Coronavirus pandemic affected your budget for civic and community engagement?

66% of businesses have decreased their budget for civic and community engagement because of the coronavirus pandemic.
