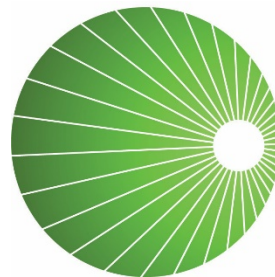

Leadership MIAMI[®] 40th

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One of the key purposes of Leadership Miami[®] is to prepare the next generation of Miamians to address vital issues affecting Miami-Dade County and meet future challenges. The program's dynamic format stimulates animated and critical discussions among participants and guest speakers.

The program offers participants the opportunity to meet Miami's leaders and to share an intensive learning experience that focuses on community issues and leadership skills through a planned process of lectures, seminars, small group discussions and leadership skills exercises.

Leadership Miami[®] is an annual program of the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with the South Florida Progress Foundation, and sponsored by several of Miami-Dade County's premier companies, local agencies and corporations.

OPENING CONFERENCE

During the two-day Opening Conference, community leaders, government officials and prominent business executives present their individual perspectives on a wide variety of topics. All presentations are followed by question and answer sessions and small group discussions led by recent Leadership Miami[®] graduates who serve as facilitators. Leadership skills form a basic component of these group workshops.

FOCUS SESSIONS

To encourage further exploration and action related to specific community issues, and to encourage the development of leadership skills, additional sessions are held one Saturday each month, following the Opening Conference. At these sessions, participants have the opportunity to develop friendships and network with peers in their assigned team for the duration of the program.

FIELDWORK

As an integral part of your Leadership Miami[®] experience and curriculum, each participant is required to complete a minimum of five fieldwork assignments in order to complete the program. The primary purpose of fieldwork assignments is to broaden your awareness of your community activities, to experience the diversity in cultures, and to encourage family involvement and networking among participants within a living-learning environment in Miami-Dade County.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

A most important and rewarding part of the program is the participation by all members in a volunteer service project of their team's choosing. The Community Service Project is a fundamental part of the Leadership Miami[®] curriculum and a requirement for completion of the program.

The purpose of this portion of the program is to broaden participants' awareness of community needs and facilitate their involvement in local volunteer programs, aid in the empowerment and revitalization of Miami-Dade County, and to provide a fun environment where participants can practice/develop team and individual leadership skills. In addition to selecting the charitable organization, each team is responsible for designing a program that will benefit the community.

GRADUATION

The program year concludes with a Graduation Celebration, held in conjunction with the Chamber's annual meeting. The session is dedicated to the review of skills and issues discussed throughout the year and to participants' presentations of their Team Community Service Projects. The Carlos Arboleya Community Service Award is presented to an outstanding current participant.

ALUMNI ACTIVITIES

Participants may continue their support of Leadership Miami[®] by serving on various planning task forces or as team facilitators. An executive board governs Leadership Miami[®] with the responsibility of administering the program each year. The board is comprised of alumni who are committed to taking an active role in the program.

Upon program completion, the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce awards all Leadership Miami[®] graduates a complimentary one-year individual membership to encourage graduates to continue their involvement and participate in Chamber activities. Graduates are invited to participate in the planning and design of the following year's Leadership Miami[®] program.

	<p style="text-align: center;">TEAM 1 ONEmiami</p> <p>In an effort to develop and empower the youth of our next generations, ONE Miami has partnered with The Miami Dade Family Learning Partnership (FLP). Our selected organization is a non-profit dedicated to families and children in our community and concentrates on family and adult literacy, family support, child welfare, literacy training and research.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">TEAM 2 MiamiBeat</p> <p>Team Miami Beat wants to help raise awareness among employees and passengers at Miami International Airport and create advocacy for parents with children on the autism spectrum who are traveling through MIA. Our team will work with the leadership at MIA to create a safe space for parents and children who are traveling by providing them access to a Multi-Sensory Environment (MSE). The benefits of MSEs are clear, the environment subtly adjusts the brain's chemistry through senses, setting the tone for motivation and functional attention, lowering stress and increasing relaxation chemistry.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">Team 3 Miami Rise</p> <p>Irie Foundation has partnered with Carnival Foundation, the Miami Heat Charitable Fund, and Big Brothers Big Sisters to house a technologically elite, state-of-the-art education center for at-risk youth. Serving as a solution to a definitive lack of structured community afterschool programs in South Florida, Irie Rhythms Academy will provide music, arts, and literacy programs at no cost to its participants.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">Team 4 Miami Roots</p> <p>The objective of our project is to improve the media facilities and upgrade the technical equipment at Urgent, Inc. so middle- and high-school students are able to develop industry-specific professional and technical skills. By providing consistent and reliable access to industry standard equipment, the students will be better prepared to enter the workforce and earn competitive wages.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">Team 5 Transform 305</p> <p>Affordable housing was one of three key issues identified during LM#39 Opening Conference where the city of Miami is in dire need of help. While creating more affordable housing is a bit out of reach within the project timeline, TRANSFORM 305 has chosen to help improve the lives of elderly residents of the Robert King High Towers in the area of Little Havana.</p>
