

The Chamber started March with the most prominent recognition of the year, honoring David Lawrence Jr. with the Sand in My Shoes Award®. His legacy as one of the greatest advocates for early childhood development and readiness in South Florida will continue to resonate for years to come.

ADVOCACY

Our Government Affairs Committee has been advocating in Tallahassee during the 2022 Legislative Session that came to an end on March 11, engaging with state officials and monitoring the development of issues that are crucial to businesses and the communities of South Florida.

The Chamber's legislative priorities -including healthcare, transportation, resiliency, tourism, education, and workforce development-, all had important bills associated to them for many municipalities, including the City of Miami and Miami-Dade. In particular, several priority projects in transportation, resilience, healthcare, and education, were funded, as were our higher education institutions like Miami Dade College and Florida International University.

NEW PROGRAM. NEW CLASS

Leadership Miami® was revamped in February, enabling participants to benefit from cutting-edge leadership training from local universities and colleges.

The Chamber partnered with Barry University, Florida International University, Florida Memorial University, the Miami Dade College, St. Thomas University, and the University of Miami, to develop a curriculum designed by renowned faculty aimed at providing a more robust experience. Classroom size was reduce by half and two classes were added each year to satisfy a higher demand.

The opening Ceremony of the 43rd Class was held on February 11 and 12. Close to 50 participants were selected for the program that aims to develop and strengthen the skills of our future leaders. Miami-Dade Mayor, Daniella Levine Cava, was among the leaders presenting at the inauguration.


AMERICAS' MISSION TO ISRAEL

On March 25, a mission of approximately 60 delegates will embark to Israel. 




2022 SOUTH FLORIDA ECONOMIC SUMMIT
